P & J Disposal not only hauls away your trash, they also make it easy for you to recycle!

An average person (and that includes you!) can reduce their trash by 30-40% through recycling. You can recycle many different things at the curb through P & J Disposal. Here are some examples:

Newspapers & Magazines Keep these separate from the rest of the recycling. Please tie with string or place in a grocery sack.

Glass Bottles and Jars All Colors. RINSE THOROUGHLY. Keep glass separate - place it in a grocery bag. Absolutely No Broken Glass!

Cardboard Only the three-layer kind with a wavy middle. Please FLATTEN and place it on the ground next to your recycle bin.

THESE ITEMS CAN BE BAGGED TOGETHER AND PLACED IN THE BIN

Paper White paper, colored paper, greeting cards, coupons, even junk mail!

Plastic Containers #1-5, & #7 Recycle jugs, bottles, and tubs. RINSE THOROUGHLY. No plastic bags, Styrofoam, or motor oil jugs.

Tin Cans, Aluminum Cans/Pieplates/Foil RINSE THOROUGHLY. No spray cans, chemical cans, or scrap metal.

Cardboard Milk and Juice Containers (the ones with pointed tops) RINSE THOROUGHLY, flatten.

Cereal and Cracker Boxes Remove inner plastic bags, flatten.

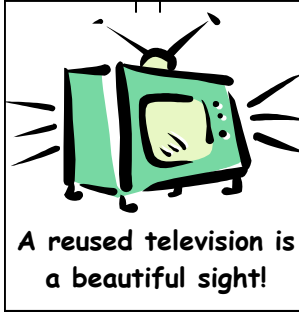




Trash less, RE-USE more!

"Tis better to Re-use than Recycle"

Other Ideas

- Maintain and repair items instead of buying new ones.
- Choose refillable over disposable.
- Rechargeable batteries can not only be used over and over, but they can be recycled when they are used up.
- Buy recyclable items.
- Take your grocery bags back to the store when you shop, and reuse them.
- Use both sides of each piece of paper. Use the back side for draft printing or scratch paper.
- Buy used products at your local thrift store.
- Place your used oil at the curb for re-refining.
- Use Tupperware at lunch.

Composting: Nature's Recycle Power

Thanks to natural decomposition, food scraps and yard trimmings can be totally recycled at home by composting. This saves you work in hauling your trash to the curb, and enriches the soil. Plus, keeping biodegradable, organic garbage out of your trash saves valuable space in the landfill!

To make composting easier, Lane County offers a Master Composter class in conjunction with the OSU Master Gardener program.

Sharps

For safety, put all used hypodermic needles in a RED rigid plastic container, like Era or Tide laundry soap, capped and labeled SHARPS.
